Letter from the Prime Minister's Special Envoy for Freedom of Religion or Belief, Fiona Bruce MP

Welcome to the EndThePersecution Toolkit! This year marks 40 years since the signing of the Declaration on the Elimination of All Forms of Intolerance and of Discrimination or Belief. Yet, ensuring that Freedom of Religion or Belief (FoRB) is a human right for all remains a considerable challenge. With 83% of the world's population living in countries where their right to FoRB is threatened or banned, this is a challenge that needs to be addressed as a matter of urgency. One of my priorities is to ensure that we move from awareness raising to action—to making a real difference in the lives of people who are losing their jobs, education, homes, livelihoods, families, freedom, access to justice and even life itself, simply on account of what they believe. These people are being discriminated against, marginalised, beaten, threatened, tortured and killed. So, I thank you for partnering with us on this campaign as we fight to EndThePersecution together.

Article 18 of the 1948 Universal Declaration of Human Rights states that “everyone has the right to freedom of thought, conscience and religion; this right includes freedom to change his religion or belief, and freedom, either alone or in community with others and in public or private, to manifest his religion or belief in teaching, practice, worship and observance”. This human right is not exclusively for people of faith, but for everyone. The freedom to hold any religion, belief, or none at all. This human right forms the basis for a stable society in which all people can freely practice their freedom of religion or belief, without fear of persecution or discrimination.

There are considerable violations against freedom of religion or belief globally today. The statistics are both shocking and staggering. For example:

- Over half of the world reside in countries deemed the highest category of religious freedom violations¹
- 4,761 Christians were murdered for their faith last year²
- Ahmadi Muslims have been denied the freedom to practise their religion for nearly 50 years by the Government of Pakistan³
- An estimated 1-3 million Uyghur Muslims, Kazakhs and other ethnic and faith groups have been detained in China since 2017⁴. Though these are referred to as “transformation-through-education” centres, details of detainee experiences have been similar to those of concentration camps⁵
- Religious minorities have repeatedly been blamed for the pandemic in countries such as China, Niger, Turkey, and Egypt⁶

On the 5th and 6th July 2022, the United Kingdom will be hosting a Ministerial level Conference in London, inviting Foreign Ministers, high level officials and international organisations from all over the globe to discuss issues relating to FoRB and protect and

implement this human right. Previous FoRB conferences have been hosted by the US and (virtually) by Poland. 2022 presents a real opportunity for the UK to champion the issue of FoRB across the world.

As we look ahead to this pivotal moment, it's important to recognise that learning, advocacy, and education remain at the forefront of our efforts to end persecution on the basis of religion or belief. No Parliamentarian or civil society group can tackle this issue on their own. I am passionate about inspiring and motivating the next generation to champion FoRB. My hope is that through the EndThePersecution campaign, young people will learn more about this fundamental human right and become Ambassadors for FoRB for years to come. This is especially important as the UK attempts to counter hate narratives currently spreading internationally. I hope that by building this campaign, young people across our nation will join in solidarity with others of their generation in countries across the world, to help build a common understanding that Article 18 ought to be upheld.

Through using this toolkit, I hope that you will feel inspired to join us on this mission. Every event takes us one step closer to ending persecution on the basis of religion or belief for all, so please do share your events on social media, using #EndThePersecution and tagging @FoRBMinisterial. Ideas for Events in your Community

Making an event to educate others on the need to EndThePersecution is a key part of improving religious literacy and boost current understanding on the scale of the problem. Although this list of potential events is far from exhaustive and those best suited to a constituency will differ, please find below some ideas for events you can hold to start conversations regarding FoRB. Remember when you're hosting any event to share it on social media, using the #EndThePersecution, to help share what you're doing with others.

School Assembly

- 1) Make a PowerPoint or similar visual aid to capture your audience's interest. Here is an [example PowerPoint](#) that you could use or edit as you see fit!
- 2) Ensure that the information you are presenting to your audience will capture their interest
- 3) Evaluate your event at the end – what went well? How could you do it differently if you were to do it next time?
- 4) Keep the conversation going! An assembly doesn't have to be the end point. See the penultimate slide in the PowerPoint for other ideas on how to keep the conversation going in your school

Poetry or Essay Competition

- 1) Launch an essay or poetry competition within your school/college/sixth form
- 2) Present your entries before a chosen panel of teachers/specialists
- 3) Send in your winning entry to the [FoRB Parliamentary Office](#), alongside details of the winners as nominees for Young Ambassador for FoRB 2022. These Ambassadors will be invited as part of a special event for the Young Ambassadors Parliamentary Assembly in early July 2022

Photography Competition

- 1) Host a photo competition in your local community (e.g. place of worship, school, sports club, etc.)
- 2) Make “EndThePersecution” your theme and announce that the winning contributions from each community will be exhibited in Westminster Hall for Parliamentarians to see
- 3) Send in your winning photo to [the FoRB Parliamentary Office](#) for your photo to be exhibited at the Ministerial Conference this summer

Encourage your MP to Host a Roundtable Discussion

- 1) Invite leaders of your local faith group to an EndThePersecution roundtable and ask them to provide you with any briefings on persecution of their faith group in countries of concern
- 2) Ask them key questions on how they would respond to persecution and discrimination on the basis of FoRB. For example:
 - a. What changes would they propose to the Government now?
 - b. What changes would they like to see discussed and implemented at the Ministerial Conference this July?
 - c. What do they think is the best holistic strategy to EndThePersecution?
- 3) Invite the faith leaders to the lobby of Parliament, taking place on Wednesday 6th July 2022. Details to follow.

Whilst the stakeholder list is not a finite list of organisations working to promote FoRB, they provide key and accurate research that will enable you to broaden your knowledge and understanding in this area. Through having a broad knowledge on the topic, you will be best equipped to tailor any event you do to your specific audience, whether that be in a place of worship or a school.

- 1) Think through who your audience is – ask yourself the following questions as you prepare your material and activities:
 - i. How old is your audience?
 - ii. Do they have any prior knowledge on the topic?
 - iii. What are you trying to achieve with your event and how can you cater that goal to this specific group?
 - iv. How can you best equip them to share what they have learnt with others?
- 2) Advertise your event and share it with others who might be interested – social media can be a great tool to do this. It's important that as many people as possible know about the event so that more people can champion this issue and tell others about it. Be sure to include #EndThePersecution in the caption!
